#### REPORTS

R1

Tom Anderson, General Manager, Planning & Development Services gave a presentation on his Department's work plan and the various ways that Planning and Development Services were working to implement the CVRD Strategic Plan. Discussion ensued. It was decided that the Communications Committee of the Environment Commission will develop ideas for interactive extension workshops to communicate the work of the Environment Commission to both the electoral area Advisory Planning and Parks and Recreation Commissions.

#### BUSINESS ARISING OUT OF MINUTES B1

Joint work with the Economic Development Commission – the EC and EDC will strike a joint working subgroup to scope an agenda for the first quarterly joint meeting of the two commissions, focusing on aligning the EDC's growth strategy and the landscape implications of the EC's State of the Environment Report, and considering the Economic Development

Commission's new Sustainable Economic Development Strategy. Chair/co-Chair named four volunteers from the Environment Commission: Roger Wiles, Rodger Hunter, Chris Wood, and Rob Hutchins.

It was noted that the correspondent's request for the Environment Commission to distribute the meeting notice to an interested distribution list was not within the Commission's designated role.

Land Committee – Justin Straker gave a summary of his recent presentation to the Board and the resulting motions made regarding the commission's recommendations.

Discussion ensued and the commission will await further information

from the Board on the inclusion of their recommendations regarding land use assessment and impact valuation during development or land use reviews. It is assumed that much of this will be a component of the proposed Sustainability Planning Process. It was requested that Warren Jones provide a brief report on the referral of these recommendations at the April Environment Commission meeting (with perhaps more detail and discussion at the May meeting), and that CVRD staff be requested to interact with the Environment Commission as they develop a response to the referral from the CVRD Board.

The co-Chair reported that staff has been directed to follow up with the province regarding the Forestry based recommendations and this is currently being done with Dr. Fraser's assistance.

#### Communications Committee - Chris Wood

It was moved and seconded that the Environment Commission budget \$2500 to acquire a localized version of the interactive ALCES web tool for illustrating the footprint implications of different development parameters, as demonstrated by Dr. Brad Stelfox at the EC's February meeting.

There was also discussion on the possibility of providing a workshop on social media to Environment Commission members and staff. This request may be made generically, but not specific to the Environment Commission as the CVRD's new Communication Committee is also looking at the role of social media as it relates to the corporation.

Looking for a chair for the Air Committee. Director Morrison will think about it and report back at the next meeting; it was further suggested that energy/carbon topics be included in the Air Committee's work.

lan Morrison presented plans for the Cowichan Lake Recreation green parking-lot storm water project. \$50,000.00 was expended to move the project forward. The upgrades would be designed to treat contaminants from vehicles & run-off.

## RE: Land dedication for large block F1 rezonings in electoral areas

A question arose as to what % of land dedication is typical within the CVRD over the last while for F1(forestry) re-zonings....are averages available, and patterns obvious? Also it has been often stated that: "at re-zoning is the time these community amenities and benefits are negotiated".

Research of <u>successful</u> CVRD re-zoning applications(F1) over the last fifteen years showed that on an average, the land dedication to the CVRD, on rezoning of <u>43.5%</u> of the land base.

The mix of land offered as part of the typical rezoning, for public use and ownership, varies from green space, parkland, watershed values, to ecologically and biologically significant lands, as well as lands such as historical Temples and cemeteries.

Some rezonings specified additional amenities such as built trails, features, playgrounds and other additional amenities that complimented the land dedications and land gifts. Some dedications occur immediately and some are phased over time.

\*(Youbou lands, a rezoning of a hybrid of Industrial and forestry lands to a comprehensive development zone has a dedication of 44% encompassing ~300 acres of park & green space.)

All things said and done the average land dedication on large block F1 rezonings as a pattern is clearly ~43.5%....sometimes more and sometimes less.
